

# Know all Men by these Presents,

that I, Enruth Robinson, of Middleborough, in the County of Plymouth and Commonwealth of Massachusetts,

in consideration of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars,  
paid by the Inhabitants of the Middleborough Fire District a  
corporation duly established by law.

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said  
Fire District a certain tract of land situated on Borden  
Hills, so called, in said Middleborough, and bounded  
and described as follows, as surveyed May 2, 1895 viz:  
Beginning at a stone in a corner on the northwesterly side  
of Warham Street said stone being also a corner of land  
owned by James Borden, thence in line of said Borden  
land and of other land of said grantor N 2 1/2 E about  
38 rods to a stone in a corner thence in line of other  
land of said grantor N 6 1/2 W about 31 1/2 rods to a stone  
on the southeasterly side of the "Old Road" so called;  
thence by said "Old Road" and said Warham Street  
southerly and south easterly about 52 1/2 rods to bound  
first mentioned containing 5 acres and 91 rods more or  
less. Being a portion of the first lot named in a deed  
of Stephen F. Borden and others to me, dated January  
14, 1882, and recorded in the Plymouth County Registry  
of Deeds, book 411 page 132 and 133, and all of a lot  
conveyed to me by Warner Alden, by deed dated Jan.  
18th 1886 to be recorded herewith.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging,  
to the said ~~Inhabitants of the Middleborough Fire District~~  
and ~~its~~ ~~successors~~ and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.

And I do hereby, for ~~and~~ <sup>said</sup> myself ~~successors~~ and <sup>my</sup> heirs, executors, and administrators,  
covenant with the grantees and ~~their~~ <sup>their</sup> ~~successors~~ and assigns, that I am  
lawfully seized in fee-simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances.

that I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I will, and  
may, heirs, executors, and administrators shall WARRANT AND DEFEND the same to the  
grantees and ~~their~~ <sup>their</sup> ~~successors~~ and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all  
persons.

And for the consideration aforesaid *S Sarah J. Robinson, wife of said*  
*Enruth Robinson.*

do hereby release unto the said grantees and ~~their~~ <sup>successors</sup> ~~heirs~~ and assigns, all right of or to both  
DOWER and HOMESTEAD in the granted premises.
